If you are a Christ follower, a Christ doubter, a Christ seeker, join me Thursday nights in July at 6:30pm in the Lower Level to learn how we can "See with New Eyes". The following are excerpts (with some edits) from the book titled the same. Come on out — it'll be fun!

Jesus said "For, in fact, the kingdom of God is among you." Throughout His ministry, He spent much of His time and energy trying to help people see God at work right where they were. God is blessing, healing, feeding, reconciling, forgiving, loving, creating, and setting people free *right now*. And you are invited to be a part of that work.

You don't need to be someone or something other than who you are right now to answer that call. Jesus is calling us, just as we are, with the clothes on our back, to jump on board and be a part of what God is up to in the world. I think it's possible to catch a glimpse of what God is doing in our context *right now!* The kingdom is among us. It is here. Right now.

The pastor of a small congregation in a mid-size town in Ontario called on the phone one sunny afternoon to say, "I get it!" Outreach team members in her congregation had spent months banging their heads against the wall trying to check off one more thing on their strategic plan for the year. They were supposed to be planning a pet blessing because the leaders who wrote the plan had discovered that a lot of people in town had pets and they thought blessing those pets would be a good outreach event. Everybody involved had the best of intentions. The problem is that none of the outreach team members knew anything about how to pull off a pet blessing. As a matter of fact, none of them even owned a pet.

The pastor, who does happen to be a pet owner, was telling this story to her vet one day. He didn't ask why a bunch of people without pets would try to plan a pet blessing. But he did wonder why they would have it at the courthouse. "Why not do it at the dog park?" he asked. The pastor got very excited about that idea. The dog park has a built-in audience! No planning required! Just show up with a sprinkler and let the blessing begin! Her vet said she might want to contain her enthusiasm long enough to phone up the chairperson of the dog park board. You know, just to ask if it'd be OK.

The dog park board couldn't have been more excited. Before you knew it, they were volunteering to do all the advertising. The pet stores in town donated doggie-bags full of treats for all the pet blessing participants. The chamber of commerce offered to cook up and give away hot dogs to the pet owners. An ice cream shop gave away free goodies to the kids who came.

And the outreach team? They helped wherever and however they were needed. Hundreds of people gathered for a hot-dog-and-ice-cream-fueled good time. Pets by the dozens — together with their owners — stood under a blue sky and received the Lord's blessing. New friends were made. A community was blessed. And people knew something holy happened that day at the dog park. Do you get it?

What our friend the pet-blessing-pastor "got" is how life-giving it is to be set free from your own agenda so that you can let yourself get caught up in God's agenda, to give up the idea of control so that you can follow where the Spirit leads, to quit beating your head against the wall of your own organization so that you can get involved in what God is up to in the world.

It might sound strange to say but, being a part of what God is up to in the world is the last thing most faith-based organizations (yes, even congregations!) have been doing. Lots of them have been doing things for God, in the name of God, or because they think they're following God's command. But they haven't actually been joining in the things God is already doing. There are a lot of reasons for this. Everything changes once you realize that God really is on the loose in the world, at work in your context, doing things in and through both you and your neighbors.

Once you "get" that, suddenly you're no longer killing yourself trying to make ministry happen. You're just paying attention — getting to know your neighbors, probing the passions and uncovering the gifts of people in your organization, asking good questions, exploring possibilities, keeping your eyes open for the things around you that are making God smile, daring to see the things that are breaking God's heart — and, when you sense a movement of the Spirit creating some new opportunity or leading you in a surprising new direction, you join in to help... *Right now!*
