



Dear Siblings in Christ,

Typically, I have no problem writing in advance. This year, however, finds me at a bit of a loss having to write about Advent and the Christmas season having not yet celebrated Thanksgiving. It makes me wonder how often I skip offering thanks and regrettably go right to the party.

What and who are you focused on this Christmas? With all the activities and church events to attend and people to see, this may be a challenging question for you to answer. So many obligations and tasks may make it difficult for you to find meaning during this special time of the year. Perhaps the loneliness of the season weighs heavy on your heart. The loss or distance of loved ones can make anyone feel alone during this time of year.

When overwhelmed by activities or isolated by loneliness, you will likely find yourself feeling somewhat lost this Christmas season—especially if your eyes aren't fixed on Jesus. Now is a time for all of us to be more intentional and to remember the awesome gift of joy God gives us - that He is with us! Right here and right now! If we keep our attention on Him, He will guide us through every situation and circumstance we encounter.

This is what Jesus desires for us. If we have our eyes fixed upon Him, we will walk in His ways and avoid running astray. The psalmist writes, "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble." Like a compass, He is faithful to show us where we are and where our next step should be.

Perhaps you're thinking, I know Christ is the reason for the Christmas season, but how can I be focused on someone I can't see and don't really know? Who is this Jesus anyway? Can I really trust Him to guide and direct me? Absolutely you can—and to help you keep your focus on the Savior, I would like to remind you of some of the titles attributed to Him in Scripture.

Jesus is Emmanuel, which means that He is God with us (Matthew 1:23). The indescribably awesome, infinite Lord of all that exists took on a form like ours and dwelt among us. Through His Holy Spirit, He is with us in every circumstance we will ever encounter. Therefore, we are never alone. Regardless of where we are or what we experience, we are assured of His wonderful, powerful, loving presence.

Jesus is our Prince of Peace (Isaiah 9:6). Even when our hectic schedules and overwhelming responsibilities increase during this season, we are assured tranquility in our relationships with Christ. He can speak solace and peace to our circumstances when everything around us is in chaos.

Jesus is the Light of the World (John 8:12). Although you and I may experience difficulties and dark moments, Christ lights the way for us. He assures us that if we faithfully walk with Him, we will not remain in darkness. The Savior will illuminate our paths and lead us to the answers we need.

Jesus is our Great High Priest (Hebrews 4:15). He is the Holy One who shared in our humanity and who bridges the gap between us and the Father—ushering us into relationships with God and teaching us His ways. Jesus intercedes for us, understands our human weaknesses, and has the ability and knowledge to meet every need we will ever have. Therefore, there is no One better to teach us how to live.

Jesus is the King of Kings and Lord of Lords (Revelation 19:16). He is the Sovereign Ruler over all that exists. No problem is too daunting for Him, and we can always trust He will act in our best interests with love, grace, and wisdom. Therefore, He is our perfect Leader who always guides our paths to triumph.

Jesus is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world (John 1:29). He is our Deliverer, Redeemer, and Savior who does what we could never do for ourselves. He reconciles us to the Father and breaks the hold sin and death have over us. Because Jesus has defeated these, our greatest foes, we can be certain that nothing we ever experience will hinder His perfect presence and provision in our lives.

So, what things are grasping for your attention this Christmas? What are you spending your time and energy trying to accomplish? I pray that if your faith should waver or you begin to feel lonely, overwhelmed, lost, or empty, you will realize that your focus is not where it should be—on the only One who can fulfill all your needs.

Jesus is worthy of your focus, worship, and praise always, regardless of the season. The Prince of Peace, Guiding Light, Great High Priest, Lord, and King—the One who willingly delivers you from all your sins and burdens—is always with you. I pray this Christmas, Christ will be foremost in your thoughts, your comfort in times of loneliness, and your refuge during storm. May He bless you greatly as you seek His face and celebrate His glorious birth.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY FOR WELCOMING ALL

Introduction/Overview

The Welcoming Team is composed of self-selected and invited individuals. The team recognizes that we need to fulfill the baptismal promises in order to welcome all people, regardless of race, economic status, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, or political persuasion. We chose to follow the Reconciling in Christ program of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. The program's goals support St. John's mission to love God and to love people.

Process

- Multiple virtual meetings with Jamie Fivecoat to organize our team
- Training provided by Reconciling Works of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America
- Workshop with Jamie and Karen Fivecoat
 - * Development of questions to ask a cross-section of the congregation
 - * Team members assigned people to interview
- Data from interviews compiled and scored on a five-point scale (scoring was subjective)

Data Results

Of the five questions asked to 40 interviewees, we determined that:

1. St. John's is more welcoming than it used to be
2. Younger people say we could do better with welcoming
3. Older people say we are doing a fine job

Next Steps

Following the steps outlined in Building an Inclusive Church, we must continue to build relationships and to map the next steps of our journey. These steps introduce change. One of the recommendations is to work welcoming all concepts into small groups. Another recommendation is to request the congregation to officially recognize welcoming all as a community ministry. Small group learning opportunities are a good way to reinforce the baptismal promises.

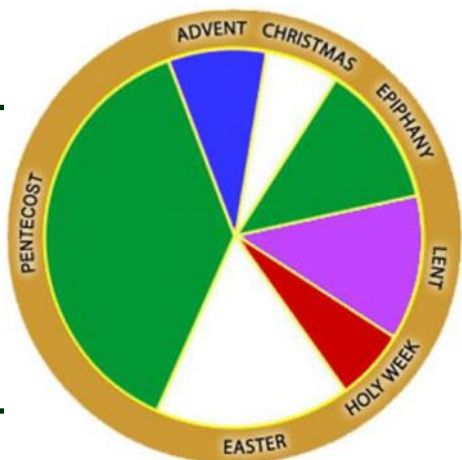

A cataclysmic event (e.g., a flood, a fire, an auto accident, a death, etc.) generally changes the life of the person experiencing it. What that person does with the change is dependent on the person and their faith.

The Shack is a work of fiction involving a cataclysmic event. I believe that God can use anything to fulfill his purposes – even a novel. This article is not a book review; it is an exploration of one of the biblical concepts found within its pages.

One of the overarching concepts in The Shack is that of relationship to God. Is God kept in a box and brought out only on Sunday mornings for an hour? Is God kept in a book and kept on a shelf – unopened and unread? Is there a feeling of being abandoned by God? Do you echo the words of the psalmist in Ps 22:1-21, Ps 69:1-3 or Ps 77:1-10? What does a cataclysmic event do to your relationship with God?

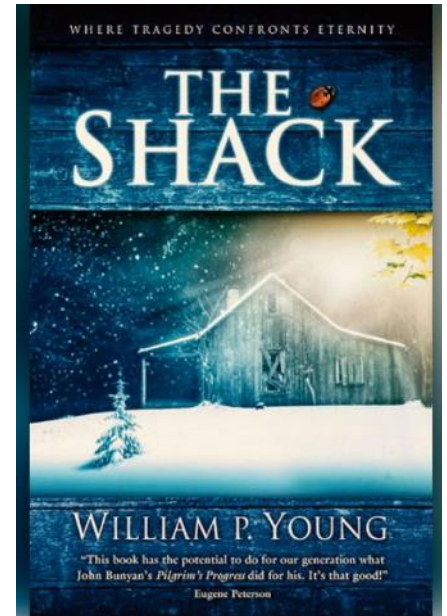
Preconceived notions of God can keep us from a relationship with him. Again, God can and does use circumstances or situations to bring his will to fruition. This promise is given by Jesus in Matthew 19:26. Even if we feel God's absence, that does not mean he is not near us.

In Genesis 1:26 and 27, God says, "Let us make humans in *our* image, to be like *ourselves*.....God created humans in his own image, in the image of God he created them, male and female." (Life Application Study Bible) (italics – mine)

Furthermore, we project what we think God *should* be based on our preconceived ideas. Can God be female? Wisdom belongs to God – and wisdom is referred to as female in Proverbs chapters 1 and 8. (Sophia is Greek for wisdom and is female.) Is the Holy Spirit female? How would you react/connect with a feminine God or Holy Spirit? Can God be both male and female? What if God is African? Or Hispanic? Or Asian? And, more importantly, does it matter?

"I am neither male nor female, even though both genders are derived from my nature. If I choose to 'appear' to you as a man or a woman, it's because I love you. For me to appear to you as a woman and suggest that you call me 'Papa' is simply to mix metaphors, to help you keep from falling so easily back into your religious conditioning." p.95, The Shack

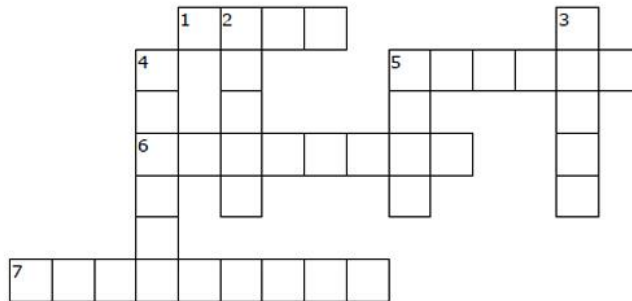
