
## Perfect Conditions and Perfect Partners Aren't Required

I had to pause when I read a little piece from Seth Godin the other day, as I am not typically one to gravitate toward brief words of wisdom. "Somewhere, there is the ideal soil for growing mangoes. Or the best possible wave for surfing. Or the most romantic sunset for a proposal. But it's not right here and it's not right now. Our success has a lot to do with how we dance with conditions that aren't quite perfect." My first reaction was to say out loud, "You'll never know 'success' until you start dancing!" I've known my fair share of people who say, "I think I'll...", "My friends say I ought to...", "I've been meaning to...", which are all thoughtful starter phrases, but not one of them is an "I'm committed to..." and "I am doing...." action phrase.

With all that's going on around the world, I get it. I understand hesitation, fatigue, and the inability to summon what it takes to take that first step. And still, I believe that God is asking us to dance even when conditions aren't quite perfect. I love that our God seems to enjoy dancing with all creation. God enjoys us and we're invited to enjoy God, too!

In the Gospel of Luke, we see that Mary's first Christmas was far from perfect. She was shamed by her own community for being an unmarried pregnant teenager. She just completed a very long journey, thanks to a nationwide census, while pregnant. She gave birth in a barn (more likely a cave) surrounded by animals. After all that, she had to be host to strange and unexpected visitors right after giving birth. These were not perfect conditions. This is how you treat your favored ones, God? How about cutting her some slack?

She could have thrown an adolescent fit, sought a place of isolation, or even screamed about her accommodations. Instead, when we read scripture, we see the character of Mary. Instead of focusing on the unknown, she focused on the one right in front of her, her brand-new baby boy, the Son of God. But Mary treasured all these things and pondered them in her heart. (Luke 2:19) I see a woman connected to God's mission to reconcile all humanity and set them free. This led her to experience complete joy during a



less than perfect time, under less than perfect conditions, surrounded by less than perfect people. We don't see fear. We don't hear bitterness. We read no words that would lead us to believe that there was anger. She willingly stepped into the gift of that miraculous moment. That's our Mary. Do you remember her words? "I am the Lord's servant. Let everything you've said happen to me." (Luke 1:38)

We really don't have to know all the steps of the journey, only that the hardships, disappointments, and celebrations along the way are directed by God. They are all precious invitations to join with God and a bunch of imperfect people in loving all creation. Let's be even more intentional in our congregational community, in Boyertown and beyond at trusting God with all our heart, mind, and soul this season and all year long. May we too say with Mary - "Let everything you've said happen to me."


The Fourth Sunday of Advent falls on Sunday, December 24 this year.

#### WHAT'S GOD UP TO IN PRESCHOOL?

On Sunday, October 22, the preschool staff were officially installed as a ministry team of St. John's church. We affirmed our commitment to minister to families and students, sharing the love of God and the practical academic and life skills of a comprehensive preschool curriculum.

Our Bible curriculum this year takes us on a chronological journey through highlights of the Old and New Testament. So far, we've explored these stories:

Creation: God made everything, and we are a part of God's good creation.

Noah: Noah was a man who followed God. God told Noah to build a boat because a flood was coming. God took care of Noah, Noah's family, and two of every kind of

animal. After the flood, God promised that there would never again be a worldwide flood. From Noah, we learn that God keeps his promises and cares for his people.

Abraham and Sarah: God told Abraham and Sarah to leave home and move far away. God also told Abraham that his family would be as numerous as the stars. The problem was that for many years, Abraham and Sarah had no children. Finally, God kept his promise and gave Abraham and Sarah a son named Isaac. From Abraham we learn that God keeps his promises and that we are part of Abraham's larger family.

Jacob and Esau: Isaac had twin sons, Jacob and Esau, who were very different from each other. Jacob and Esau had a conflict over a blessing from their father Isaac. After many years they made peace. From Jacob and Esau we learn that God made all of us different. We learn to address conflict and try to make peace. We also learn that God blesses us.

Joseph: Joseph had 11 brothers. These brothers were so jealous of Joseph that they arranged for him to go to Egypt as a slave. God took care of Joseph in Egypt, where he eventually took charge of a project to save food for a time of famine. When Joseph's brothers came to Egypt looking for food, they found Joseph. They apologized, and Joseph forgave them. From Joseph we learn two important and difficult phrases: I'm sorry and I forgive you.

It's been a busy month in the preschool! In addition to the Bible lessons, we study a letter of the alphabet each week. So far, we've done L, F, E, and H. Why don't the letters go in alphabetical order? Our academic curriculum introduces letters based on the pencil strokes used to form each uppercase letter, so we are teaching children to form and write the letters as well as identify the letters and sounds. This approach gives attention to children's fine motor development as well as their literacy needs.

In October, classes engaged in activities surrounding the theme of Harvest. We explored types of apples, dissected pumpkins, and more. We welcomed families into the school for a Halloween party and parade, sharing snacks, crafts, stories, and games. Later we took a trick-or-treating expedition to Walnut Woods where we enjoyed interactions with residents and staff.

Speaking as part of the preschool staff, we are thankful to be a part of this ministry and appreciate the welcome and support of the church family. Thank you!







#### THE REASON FOR THE SEASON?

It's December! For many, especially children, "It's The Most Wonderful Time of the Year." It is also the time of the year when we hear the slogan, "Jesus is the reason for the season." How do you feel about that slogan?

I take issue! Jesus is not "the reason for the season." For devoted Christians, Jesus is "the reason for all of life" — our lives! Read Colossians 3:1-4! Paul reminds us that Christ is "our life." We "died" and "were raised with Christ," an allusion to our repentance and baptism (2:11-12). We "seek those things which are above" and our minds are set "on things above." Our lives are "hidden with Christ in God." A "season" may be long enough for those of a secular mindset, for those who give a little thought to Jesus this time of the year. But to God's faithful a "lifetime" is not long enough to serve the Lord we love! He is not "the reason for our season" — He is "the reason for our surrender."





We rejoice every day that God sent His Son into the world to save us — the story of His birth being a part of that grander scheme. Many are enamored with the story of Jesus' birth because a babe in a manger makes no demand upon their lives. They can have God without obligation. They can talk about His birth, sing a carol or two and then walk away! The emphasis of the gospel, however, is on the Lordship of Christ, not the birth of Christ. In the first sermon to the Jews Peter declared that Jesus is "both Lord and Christ" (Acts 2:36). In the first sermon to the Gentiles he declared that Jesus is "Lord of all" (Acts 10:36). His birth is only the beginning of the story! Surrendering to Him as Lord is the story! Wise men still seek Him! Wise men surrender to Him as Lord!
